Safety Tips for Other Drivers

Watch your blind spots. Motorcycles are out and they are smaller than other vehicles. Be extra aware of those blind spots when you change lanes or turn.

Don't tailgate. You don't like, and you're in a full size vehicle. Motorcyclists are at a greater risk because they don't have that extra room between themselves and your vehicle. And you can easily lose sight of them as they blend into a larger vehicle ahead.

Slow down behind motorcycles. Motorcycles react differently to road conditions. They maneuver quicker, faster and without as much visual notice to a driver behind them.

Use your turn signals. As with any other driver, let them know where you intend to go. Be especially careful with left turns.

Watch headlights. Motorcycles are at a different height than most vehicles, your high beams could be right in that rider's face.
