The end of Hot Dog season?

Labor Day came about in the **late 19th century**.

The first Labor Day was **Tuesday, September 5, 1882**. An estimated 10,000 workers, organized by a labor union, "marched" in New York City to protest working conditions.

Today there are approximately 14 -15 million union members in the workforce. With the National Education Association (3 million members) being the largest.

Canada thought of Labor Day first, in 1872.

Oregon was the first state to declare Labor Day as an official holiday in 1887.

Congress passed an act in 1894 making the first Monday in September of each year the legal Labor Day holiday.

Labor Day is considered the **unofficial start to the Fall football season and the end of Summer**.

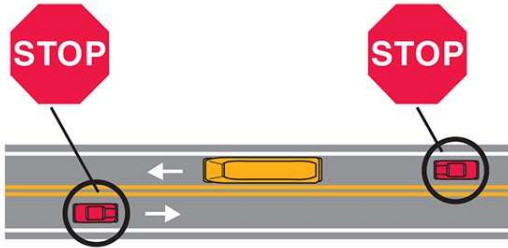

The first **Waffle House** opened on Labor Day in 1955, in Georgia.

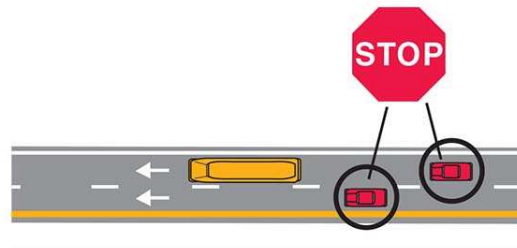
Not wearing white after Labor Day tradition: is accepted to having originated in the late Victorian era. Summer clothing was generally light weight and light in color (white). So after Summer vacations, Summer clothing was put away and heavier, darker clothing designed for the cold of Winter was brought out.

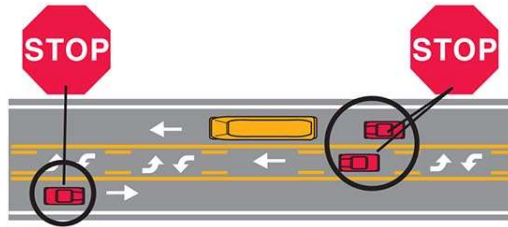
School Bus Stop Law



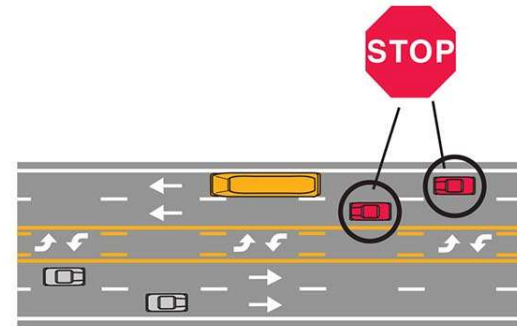
Two-lane roadway: When school bus stops for passengers, all traffic from both directions must stop.



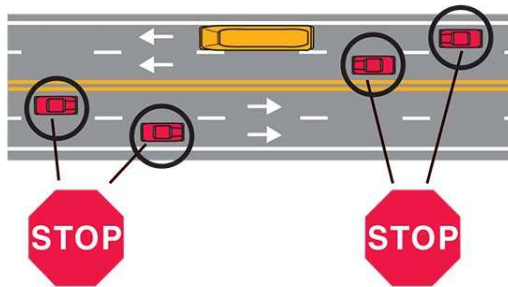
Divided highway of four lanes or more with a median separation: When school bus stops for passengers, only traffic following the bus must stop.



Two-lane roadway with a center turning lane: When school bus stops for passengers, all traffic from both directions must stop.



Roadway of four lanes or more with a center turning lane: When school bus stops for passengers, only traffic following the bus must stop.



Four-lane roadway without a median separation: When school bus stops for passengers, all traffic from both directions must stop.
