Stop the mail and newspaper delivery. Ask a neighbor to pick up any packages or notices left at your door.

Don't hide a key outside. Thieves know where keys are hidden.

Set timers for lights – set them for an odd time.

Take just the cards and cash you need and keep them in a front pocket.

Lock Everything! Obviously, lock your car. But think about your home as well. Even if you have family coming in who want to arrive while you're at work or out shopping, find another way to give them access.

SET the alarm in your home. If you have house guests, make sure they know how to use the alarm system. You can change passcodes later if needed.

Don't tell the social media world where you are. Be careful with online store checkin apps. If a thief knows you're out shopping, they might take that opportunity.

Use a computer you control, making sure the anti-virus and malware software is up to date and running correctly.

Make sure you know and trust the website you're using.

Use a credit card instead of a debit card. And use a card you can easily check online to make sure your charges are correct.

Use strong passwords and change them after you've finished shopping for the year.

After the holidays, break any boxes down and make sure they fit inside your garbage or recycle containers. Don't advertise to potential thieves what really great gifts you received!

Turn your tree and other holiday lights off when you leave or go to bed.

If you purchase a live tree, make sure to inspect it for critters before you bring it in your house. Some insects lay their eggs in trees for the Winter. They may hatch when they get warm and toasty in your home - with you.
